



Scholarship Program concluded for needy and brilliant University Students for (2018-19)

Nishkam Sikh Welfare Council (Regd.) along with Sikh Human Development Foundation (SHDF) has paid scholarships worth Rs. 1, 81, 30,000 to 865 students across Punjab and Delhi region. These students are brilliant in academic performance but are from economically challenged families. The scholarships are given with the objective of reducing the economic hardships of such students who pursue professional courses in order to enable them to compete with other students for better professional opportunities after studies. This scholarship is provided up to Graduation/Post graduation level of the student who is pursuing professional Degree/Diploma courses. The events were concluded at Baba Farid Law College- Faridkot (combined venue of Faridkot, Moga and Bathinda centers, Dt- 16 Feb); Guru Nanak Dev University- Amritsar, Dt-17 Feb.; Nishkam Bhawan, New Delhi Dt: 17 Feb and at Guru Nanak Dev Engineering College, Ludhiana, Dt: 24 Feb (combined venue of Ludhiana and Chandigarh centers) Speeches from versatile and prominent dignitaries enthralled the audience and they praised the selfless mission for education.

SHDF Scholarships: Sikh Human Development Foundation (SHDF) is an organization run by NRIs based in Washington- USA and they offer scholarships every year to marginalized but brilliant students. This year Scholarships worth Rs. 1,51,45,000 has been awarded to 676 students. Nishkam Sikh Welfare Council (Regd.), the associate partner of SHDF has been imparting, organizing and promoting the scholarships & workshops since 2000 in India. We have been following the tradition of "Sarbat da Bhala" (welfare of all) which is one of the core values of Sikhism, whilst serving the suffering humanity irrespective of Caste, Creed and Religion. We are nurturing the youth of such marginalized families to let them stand to get decent jobs or be gainfully self-employed. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship: A total of Rs. 29.85 Lakhs in scholarships has been awarded to 189 students. The aim of the scholarship initiative is to provide financial support to bright but needy students who achieve academic distinctions in arts, commerce, science and professional courses.

However these senior citizens have pains as they are abandoned by their children. They had no option but to take refuge in old-age homes. These people then had good times, but have pain and sadness in their hearts now. Such initiatives not only uplift their morale but also bring a spark in their lives.

As part of our strategy to train and empower the underprivileged with permanent skills and enabling them to earn their livelihood, we have set up Computer training centers in Delhi as well as in Punjab. The courses are for three months each, starting with the basics and progresses ahead with detailed knowledge in the usage of computers. 16 students were given certificates.



S. Udeshpal Singh- Faculty Member at Nishkam Computer Center said, "Secondary education is insufficient to earn a dependable livelihood. Students from destitute areas are easily pushed towards drugs addiction or crime. Nishkam provides vocational training to low-literate youth in computer education so they can earn a dependable livelihood and finally break the cycle of poverty."

Computer training centers running at Nishkam Bhawan- Delhi, Guru Nanak Dev University- Amritsar, Bhai Kanhaiya Nishkam Computer Center- Fardikot and Nishkam Computer Center at Yamuna Nagar serve more than 550 students. Upon completion of the computer course students are awarded with certificates.

IMPACT: Varsha's father is a Driver and earning less to provide quality education to her. She has joined the course last year and feeling confident for her job prospects as she's passionate about designing. She was not familiar with computers but now gained confidence with practice. Success Story of Gurminder Singh

Gurminder Singh grew up in a business class family in Ambala-Harvana having limited income resources. His father was running a small confectionery store. Everything was running smoothly till his school days but all days are not equal. They were not earning well through that small candy shop. With high hopes and relying on relatives, they left Ambala and sold their ancestors property. His father started a spare part business at Yamuna Nagar and took a loan to build the home. He also got admission in Engineering course at Guru Nanak Dev Engineering College- Ludhiana. All these events happened in guick succession and they were suddenly in debt. His mother also started stitching clothes at home but his high fee was getting heavy on the financial resources. They felt that they got themselves chained in bank loans and poverty crept in.

"I told my father it is not worth pursuing my education, in such critical conditions. I should take up a job and earn for the family. My father said - "Gurminder, you can make money whenever you want but you won't be able to learn later. This is a difficult time, don't worry. Look at me. I could not study further and had to compromise for that petty shop, so I know the value of time and education. We will somehow manage it, just do not leave your studies. This assurance was worth for me but from inside I was shallow, life is practical and I know I need financial support. I discussed my problem with my Professors and friends and they have shown me the way for SHDF Scholarships." That was the first step for success in Gurminder's life. He appeared for scholarship exam and interviews and cleared the path after achieving it. He earned scholarships for two consecutive times. He was good in programming and voluntarily approached the computer department at college for Punjabi Font's programming and selflessly worked as per their needs. He further moved his potential towards Karnataka with building network and relations and become Research Scholar at Indian Institute of Sciences (IIS- Bangalore) After that, he never looked back and kept moving forward. After 14 years journey, he is now working successfully as a Chief Engineer in Samsung Research Institute- Noida.
