Over 370 students appeared for Nishkam's school-level scholarship Interviews

Likewise every year a record number of students from underprivileged families applied for the scholarships, out of which around 370 students appeared. The interviews were conducted at Sukho Khalsa Sr. Sec. School, Tilak Nagar (common centre for Delhi zone) on 6 March 2022. Nishkam is committed to providing scholarships to deserving and needy school students every year. Special groups are set up by Nishkam to screen the applications and conduct the interviews.







Around 1700 students appeared in the college-level scholarship interviews

The (2021-22) college-level scholarship interviews were conducted across Punjab and Delhi (Jan- Feb.) More than 1690 students appeared with hopes. The result was finally displayed on Nishkam's website, and candidates were individually notified also through SMS on their registered mobile numbers.

The interview panel mainly consisted of retired public/private sector professionals, working professionals, educationists and social workers. They interviewed and assessed the students to determine their eligibility, ability and financial status.

A Path To Recovery after lockdown: Re-opening of Vocational Centres

We are open and committed to delivering the education again to our children after repeated lockdowns. Children are coming regularly and taking the advantage of extra support with the help and motivation of our committed teachers. Since the beginning of 2022, despite the Omicron variant, schools were not opened in the capital which had majorly affected the regular studies and exams. After the curb was over in March, we opened our centre supported by health and safety protocols and saved many from a drop-out situation. Since its outbreak two years ago, the COVID-19 pandemic has disrupted education systems globally, affecting the most vulnerable learners the hardest. Similarly, we have opened our Music centre and other vocational centres in the Nishkam Bhawan.





Bringing a ray of hope to Anita's life

Anita, 43, has seen enough tragedies in recent years. She lost her mother in March 2021, who's already taking family assistance from Nishkam since 2017. During that time, Anita was living with her along with her daughter after separating from her husband, who's alcoholic and often beats her, resulting in a tragic divorce. Anita's health is not up to the mark. She's having a neurological imbalance (fits) and cannot work properly as a Housemaid. The lockdown due to the pandemic left her with no hopes and entirely relied on Nishkam's help. We provided her ration kits and family assistance and paid the education assistance to her 19-yearold daughter in a BA degree course. Thanks to generous donors like you, Nishkam has brought an air of normalcy to Anita and her daughter's life. Yet, many more like her are from vulnerable families who need your help.

A new look for Nishkam Library

On 23 March 2022, the library building was inaugurated with the latest facilities. A fully equipped library, with over five thousand books, was set up in the basement of Nishkam Bhawan. The premises got renovated in just two years amidst a challenging lockdown period. The initiative taken by Nishkam would enable children at home to prepare for higher education and entrance exams. The location of the Library in Tilak Delhi would also help children of Viharunderprivileged families residing in the area to access the books without spending money on purchasing the expensive books. There are no libraries in the area, and we hope that other students in the locality, too, can access the books stocked here. Most of the books are based on competitive entrance exams and government job preparation. There's a provision for accessing the knowledge through computers as well. The sudden shift to digital teaching was challenging for students, especially in their houses with a small setup of 1-2 rooms where families and little children make noises 24X7. The grim reality of not purchasing the competitive books, etc., puts a significant pressure on the student's minds where they need a life's peace and infrastructure that lets them focus and be productive for their career development.
