# Scholarship Interviews of underprivileged university students

On 28th October, the scholarship interviews were conducted across 5 centres namely, Faridkot, Moga, Ludhiana, Amritsar and Chandigarh (4th Nov.) in Punjab and at Nishkam Bhawan in New Delhi. A total of 562 candidates appeared out of 621 short listed for 2018-19. The procedure started in a well arranged manner in various educational institutions coupled with cooperative approach from the local volunteers and Nishkam members. The students were addressed on moral values and their active involvement in nurturing the mindset for inclusive growth through coordinators and Nishkam members. India has more than 50% of its population below the age of 25 and more than 65% below the age of 35. Considerable progress has been made, but still the large number of young adults' give-up their dream of attaining education due to poverty. Nishkam for very long time has been striving to meet that need with the support of our donors and volunteers through various scholarship schemes. We may add that the interviews of the students eligible for renewal of scholarship were held while the written test was conducted for new students in September. Nishkam in association with Sikh Human Development Foundation, USA (SHDF) invite applications for scholarships from regular students studying in recognized Colleges and Universities for Professional Degree/Diploma Courses.

#### Protection of Nishkam staff through Hepatitis B vaccination

To protect the staff members from Hep- B, Nishkam introduced a vaccination program. The vaccination was done by Dr. JS Nanra- Nishkam President. Free health consultation post vaccination was also given pertaining to this vaccination at our Nishkam Medical Centre in Nishkam Bhawan by expert Doctors. Considering the above a booster dose of Hepatitis B was given to staff after one month.

Hepatitis B is a liver disease caused by the hepatitis B virus (HBV). The virus can cause lifelong infection, cirrhosis (scarring) of the liver, liver cancer, liver failure and death. It is transmitted through blood, body fluids and to a newborn from his mother.
