A chance meeting with a local coordinator of the Nishkam Sikh Welfare Council (NSWC) emerged as a lifeline, offering the beacon of hope that his family desperately needed. Recognising their potential and commitment, NSWC provided crucial, timely, and consistent support, making education a tangible reality for Kishan.

He began his foundational learning in Bangalore and, with the support of Nishkam, completed his matriculation. Driven by a dream to enter the medical field, he pursued the Science stream at Shri Gavisiddheshwara Science College, Koppal, excelling in both years. Ignited by a passion to scale new heights, Kishan Singh moved to Hubli, where he earned a B.Sc. degree and then achieved the significant milestone of clearing the competitive Karnatak University PG entrance exam, which is a remarkable feat in his Sikligar community, securing admission for PG studies in Zoology. Throughout this demanding academic climb, Nishkam remained a constant pillar – financially and as a vital source of hope, encouragement, and moral strength.

Today, Kishan Singh stands proud as a Professor of Zoology. He has transformed his struggles into a source of inspiration, actively mentoring and preparing students for crucial competitive exams like KCET and NEET. Earning a respectable livelihood, he and his family have achieved a remarkable transformation directly attributed to the belief and support invested in them during their most challenging times. Nishkam continued this ripple effect of support and, recognising potential, extended assistance to four of his siblings as well, who are all actively pursuing their higher education.



Breaking Barriers with Words: Nishkam Launches Free English Classes to Empower Underprivileged Youth

In a nation where English fluency can dictate career opportunities, Nishkam is attempting to bridge this asymmetrical gap for underprivileged students by providing free spoken English classes to unlock new avenues for education and employment.

Nishkam's English language classes are meant to reduce the socio-economic divide and improve conversational fluency through this Initiative for about 40+ students (ages 10–20) in daily classes providing beginner to upper-intermediate support and through Confidence-building exercises like group discussions, role-plays, and public speaking.

Reviving History through Movie Screening

Screening of movie 'Guru Nanak Jahaj' inspires Youth with Sikh Courage and forgotten history of Kamagata Maru" Over 100 students from Sikh and diverse cultural backgrounds attended a special screening on May 25 of an inspirational film 'Guru Nanak Jahaj', highlighting the courage of forgotten Sikh leaders Gurdit Singh, Mewa Singh and many others and their fight for justice.

The film chronicles the 1914 Kamagata Maru tragedy, where 376 Punjabi passengers, mostly Sikhs, were denied entry into Canada due to discriminatory laws, leading to a standoff and their forced return to India with the use of violence. Interwoven with the teachings of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, the movie emphasises themes of justice, perseverance, and moral courage and is aimed at educating youth about forgotten chapters of Sikh history.

The movie provided students with an engaging and accessible window into the courage and resilience of the Sikh community, particularly during the challenging events of the Kamagata Maru incident. By illuminating this often-overlooked chapter of history, movie has helped bridge the asymmetrical gap between past and present, encouraging students to reflect on themes of justice, perseverance, Sikh faith & cultural identity.

Educators and attendees alike have shared in their feedback as to how 'Guru Nanak Jahaj' not only brought to fore forgotten heroes, their heroic deed in Canada over 100 years ago but also sparked thoughtful discussions and curiosity among many learners to explore their own heritage or a yearning to advocate inclusivity and carry the core message of Sikhi "ਭੈ ਕਾਹੂ ਕਉ ਦੇਤ ਨਹਿ ਨਹਿ ਭੈ ਮਾਨਤ ਆਨ" in India and abroad.
